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⊡ocus on Make-up

You should look like you - but better! A little make-up goes a long way in evening out your skin tone, giving definition to your eyes and adding colour to your cheeks. For brides who are not daily makeup wearers, it may feel like you are wearing too much, but trust me, that long white dress can wash you out.

Agnes, a bride from last summer was convinced too much makeup was applied. The makeup artist asked me to take a quick photo and after I showed Agnes the result on the camera screen, she agreed that it looked natural. They did a great job using soft browns to define her blue eyes and the effect was even better once she put on the gown!



the trees. Not only was the lighting uneven, but it was also very green. The little twinkle in their eyes is good give-away that additional lighting was used.

A cool effect you can try is to force the flash even if you don't need it - it will create a brighter-than-day look. As with all tips, I'm going to assume that you are using a digital point-and-shoot camera, with limited manual override. If you are a lucky one with a DSLR, then you can experiment with manual flash, aperture and shutter speed settings.

Snapshot Tip

Last time we talked about turning off the flash. This time we'll talk about using fillflash. Photography is all about using light strategically - and some situations call for a bit more light courtesy of your on-camera flash. If your subject is significantly darker than the background (i.e. sun behind the subject), or there are strong shadows on the face (i.e. sun directly overhead creates raccoon eyes) you want to combat, then force the flash to fire. The closer you are to the subject, the brighter the effects of the flash.
